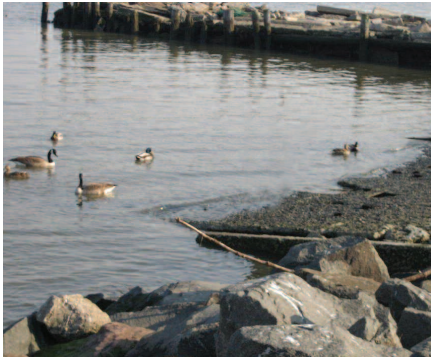

Rockland's new Comprehensive Plan makes the protection of a pollution-free Hudson River a top priority. Harriet initiated and helped draft the plan to safeguard natural resources and quality of life in Rockland.



Harriet organized and chairs Homeland Security Task Force of FBI, state and local officials which identifies vulnerabilities and takes action. She supports the Narcotics Task Force which brings millions in asset forfeiture funds to Rockland.



Harriet created Rockland 21C; now 40 Family Resource Centers exist in schools throughout Rockland. Her 2006 report, *Rockland's Voices: Making the Case for Amending No Child Left Behind*, influenced Congress with its proposed changes and emphasis on accountability.



Harriet is Rockland's leading voice on transportation issues: ensuring public input regarding the Tappan Zee Bridge, fighting toll and fare increases and air traffic redesign. At left, she confers with Legislator Toney Earl about her opposition to the unfair MTA payroll tax.

Harriet sponsored the Multi-Year Finance Plan Law requiring the Rockland County Executive to submit such plan annually to give a true picture of the county's financial situation. Choices can then be made in advance to avoid sudden tax increases or dramatic budget cuts.



Harriet's leadership in bringing together Nyack and Good Samaritan Hospitals in an innovative program to combat hospital-acquired MRSA infections earned her a statewide award, which applauded her "exceptional and selfless leadership... for the good of the entire community."
